#### **DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

- 1. National Metastatic Breast Cancer Day, October 13, 2021 -Mayor Shortway received a request to consider recognizing this day publicly and presenting a Proclamation to resident Tara Kuipers. The consensus of the Council was to proceed with the proclamation during the Open Public meeting.
- 2. Use of Borough Hall parking lot requests The Borough Administrator/Clerk received a request from the Girl Scouts to use the municipal parking lot for a clothing drive on Sunday, November 21<sup>st</sup> and will be using the same company that other groups have used in the past. After some discussion the Council decided to allow it.
- 3. Tennis Courts Review of outdated ordinance. After much discussion, which

included possible penalties, residence status, signage and rules, the Council decided to prohibit all for-profit tennis lessons on the public courts, directed a revision of the posted signage and assigned the Borough Clerk to redo the ordinance and forward it to the Borough Attorney for review.

conditions with employees or representatives of employees of the public body (Specif
contract):
Any matter involving the purpose, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the
setting of bank rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public
interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed;

Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law;

Any deliberation of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party as a result of an act of omission for which the responding party bears responsibility;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Borough Council hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) may be made public at a time when the Borough Attorney advises the Borough Council that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the Borough, or any other entity, with respect to said discussion. That time is currently estimated as the time of said matter.
