DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Recreation – Midland Park/Waldwick Jr. Wrestling Program – Insurance.

Administrator/Clerk Martin advised the Governing Body of the concerns of moving forward with the Insurance for the newly formed Midland Park/Waldwick Jr. Wrestling Program. After much discussion, including a history of the past program and how other sports organizations handle insurance, the Council directed Borough Administrator/Clerk Martin to have the Recreation Director reach out to the Wrestling organization to have them research self-funding for insurance. The Council is pleased to expand the sports association to include wrestling but feels they should follow the lead of the other sports organizations with self-funding.

2. Zoning – Fast Food – Drive Through's

Administrator/Clerk Martin explained the background of how this ordinance was brought about. Zoning Officer Berninger answered questions and explained some of the process that must happen to make it final. The Council decided to add this to this evening's Open Public Meeting agenda. This ordinance does not prohibit fast food eateries from coming into the Borough but does prohibit restaurants from having drive-throughs. It does not exclude banks or pharmacies, et cetera from having drive-throughs.
