Snow Removal Laws Enforced

It is a property owner's responsibility to clear snow and ice from the sidewalk bordering their property. The Borough Code pertaining to shoveling of the sidewalks will be strictly enforced. It is required that sidewalks be shoveled within 24 hours of daylight after a snowfall. A summons will be issued by the police for noncompliance with this ordinance. Keep fire hydrants cleared of snow. Do not shovel snow into the street.

News for New Homeowners

Welcome to **Midland Park** and congratulations on your new home! If you did not receive the tax bill from the previous owner, and you do not have a mortgage company escrowing your taxes, please call the tax office at 551-600-8280 to have one printed for you. By statute, it is the homeowner's responsibility to ascertain the amount and due dates of property taxes.

Tax Assesor's Office

The Tax Assessor is responsible for the valuation of property in the Borough of Midland Park. This includes any improvements that are made to the property each year. Improvements are valued either through review of building plans or by physical inspection made by the tax assessor or his inspector. These physical inspections are usually made without prior appointments when the weather permits.

An "added assessment" for the improvement is placed on the property and payable to the Tax Collector on November 1st each year.

How & When to Pay Your Property Taxes:

- Tax payments are due **February 1, May 1, August 1, and November 1** of each year. There is a 10-calendar day grace period each quarter, however it is important to note that interest accrues from the original due date for any payments received after the 10-calendar day grace period.
- Interest is at the rate of 8% per annum on the first \$1500.00 and 18% on the amount in excess of \$1500.00. According to N.J.S.A. 54:4-67, a penalty of 6% will be charged on any delinquency, accrued in the calendar year, exceeding \$10,000.00 as of December 31.

Paying Online: If you are paying your taxes online, please note that when you enter a payment in the system, your Checking Account or Credit Card will be charged that day. If you pay by ACH (electronic bank transfer) or e-check, there is a \$1.95 convenience fee per transaction. For all other debit card and credit card payments the fee is 2.95% of your total bill.

Pay By Mail: If you are mailing in your payment and you wish to receive a receipt, a self-addressed stamped envelope should be included with your entire tax bill. Your receipt will appear on the reverse side of your bill.

Pay in Person: When making your payments in person, if you wish to receive a receipt, the tax bill in its entirety must accompany the payment.

Drop Box: For your convenience, there is a secure drop box located outside of the main entrance of the municipal building. All payments received through the drop box will be posted to your account the following day. **Please DO NOT leave cash payments in the drop box.**

Post-Dated Checks: **PLEASE DO NOT SEND POSTDATED CHECKS** - The law requires our office to deposit payments as soon as they are received, and we cannot accept "post-dated" checks. Therefore, please date your check the day you write it out, just as you would if you were paying in person.

Cut It and Leave It

Grass clippings lend themselves to a natural way of recycling, the "cut it and leave it" method. It is highly recommended as a time and money saving program. Homeowners who leave grass clippings on their lawns will reduce their mowing time by 20-25% since they don't spend time bagging. In addition, since the clippings serve as a nutrient, it saves money on fertilizer, as well as grass bags.

Curbside Pickup

Garbage and Household Trash

- Garbage will be collected on Mondays and Thursdays, year-round **except** on **Monday, January 1, Monday, May 27, Thursday, July 4** (Pickup will be Friday, July 5), **Monday, September 2, Thursday, November 28** (Pickup will be Friday, November 29)
- Household refuse, non-recyclable food containers (such as pizza boxes), table waste, and disposable diapers are accepted.
- Put garbage at the curb in barrels or plastic bags, with a **limit of two items** (bags or barrels) per pickup **AFTER 12 Noon** the day **BEFORE** your scheduled pick-up.

Bulk Items

- Bulk items are **ONLY** collected on Thursdays.
- **Limit 2 bulk items accepted per household per pick-up day.**
- Bulk items include carpeting and rugs (bundled), furniture, broken mirrors, and non-recyclable items. Construction materials, stone, rock, concrete or asphalt will **NOT** be accepted.

Recyclables

- The collection of recyclables will take place on **alternate Fridays**.
- **Commingled**, includes glass, aluminum, tin, and plastic containers, and must be placed curbside in barrels.
- **Paper/cardboard** are collected tied in bundles or in paper bags, **not plastic bags**.

White Goods (Appliances, Metal, etc.)

- White goods are collected on the **first Wednesday of each month**.
- **You must call 551-600-8290 or email mtauber@midlandparknj.com PRIOR TO THE FIRST WEDNESDAY OF THE MONTH** (You will not receive a call or email back; you will be placed on the pickup list for the next 1st Wednesday.)
- Items that are accepted include washing machines, dryers, refrigerators (with doors removed), freezers, dishwashers, ranges, trash compactors, hot water heaters, lawn mowers (fuel removed), air conditioners, and grills.

Yard Waste

- **Vegetative waste** is collected on **Wednesdays from April 3rd - October 16th**.
- Grass clippings should be placed in open barrels or paper bags, no larger than 30 gallons and weighing no more than 50 pounds.
- Branches must be less than four feet in length and tied in bundles. Large branches can be taken to the recycling center.
- After October 12, grass clippings, brush and small branches (less than 1" diameter) can be added to loose leaves.

The Recycling Center, located on the corner of Greenwood Avenue and Birch Street, is open

- Tuesday 9 am - 3 pm
 - Wednesday 12 pm - 6 pm
 - Thursday, Friday and Saturday 9 am - 3 pm.
- It is **closed** Sunday and Monday.


Materials accepted at the recycling center are:

- Commingled, including glass, aluminum, tin and plastic containers.
- Paper, including newspaper, junk mail, catalogs, magazines, telephone books and paperback books.
- Cardboard, including corrugated and chipboard (**but not pizza boxes**)
- Leaves, brush and branches are accepted year-round, but grass clippings are not accepted.
- Household batteries, rechargeable only (no car or alkaline batteries)
- Auto tires, collected during June (no rims). Limit of 4 tires per resident per year. Scrap metal (no propane tanks), lawn mowers (fuel removed), storm doors, aluminum siding.
- Clothing, shoes (drop boxes)
- Computer and electronic recycling, pcs, laptops, printers, fax machines, DVD players, VCRs, and TVs

Construction materials are **NOT** accepted at the Recycling Center. You must use a private contractor to dispose of these materials.

Hazardous waste items such as oil base paints, solvents and thinners, motor oil, gasoline, antifreeze, chemicals, and pesticides and herbicides are not accepted at the recycling center. These items can be disposed of on one of the hazardous waste collection days sponsored by the Bergen County Utilities Authority. The Borough of Midland Park's Pet Licensing Renewal Period is May 1st to June 15th - per Chapter 5 "Animal Control" of the Municipal Code. The Borough will begin renewing pet licenses **by mail only** as of May 1, 2024.

Proof of current rabies vaccination must be provided. Per NJ State law, the rabies vaccine duration must extend through a minimum of ten months of the licensing year, which in Midland Park is May 2024 – May 2025. Therefore, any rabies vaccine that expires before March 1, 2025, will require an updated vaccine prior to issuance of a pet license renewal.

Animal Licensing costs are \$12.00 for dogs and cats, or \$15.00 if the animal is not spayed/neutered. Please make your check payable to "Borough of Midland Park" and include the registration form available on the Borough website, proof of rabies vaccination, proof of spaying/neutering even if your pet is already in our system. **You must also include a self-addressed stamped envelope.**

Paperwork and fees can be mailed to: Borough Hall Attn: Pet Licensing, 280 Godwin Ave, Midland Park, NJ 07432 or dropped off in the "Tax Payments/Pet Licensing" mailbox outside the front door of Borough Hall.

A \$10.00 late fee will be strictly enforced as of June 15th. Please also note, if the license is not renewed by June 30th, a summons will be issued. Please notify us at 201-445-5720, if you no longer have a pet to be licensed.

Free Rabies Vaccination Program

The Midland Park Board of Health will be holding its annual Rabies Program to give **FREE Rabies Vaccinations on Monday, May 13th from 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm** at the Municipal Building, 280 Godwin Avenue in Midland Park, NJ.

Dogs must be on leashes and cats must be in carriers; both dogs and cats are welcomed at any time. **NO** retractable leashes can be used. Residents from other municipalities are welcome to bring their pets to the program.

Rabies vaccinations are required by the NJ Department of Health for ALL dogs and cats four months of age and older (but not less than 12 weeks of age). A booster vaccination should be given one year later and every three years thereafter. Please check the status of your dog's or cat's rabies vaccination records. Rabies is always a potential danger to humans and domestic animals if exposed to a rabid animal. Be proactive and have your pets vaccinated.

Midland Park Ambulance Corps

Formed on March 1, 1942, a group of dedicated citizens joined together and started the Midland Park Community Ambulance to provide emergency medical care to the residents of the Borough of Midland Park.

Now 80+ years later, the Midland Park Ambulance Corps is staffed by fully trained National Registry and New Jersey State Department of Health certified Emergency Medical Technicians. All are volunteers working only for the satisfaction that they are helping their community in a very important way.

In 2014, the Ambulance Corps moved to its current location at 471 Godwin Ave., a beautiful building generously renovated for the purpose, and donated by the late David Bolger and The Bolger Foundation. Self-funded by generous donations from the community, the Midland Park Ambulance Corps maintains the building and two fully equipped ambulances, always ready for any emergency medical situation. Our volunteers are ready, willing, and able to provide emergency care 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

We were able to purchase a 2022 PL Custom Ambulance in April 2022 with many generous donations over the years, and it is furnished with current medical technology. We are now looking forward to replacing our 1996 Ford Horton ambulance with a new one in the near future. If you are interested in volunteering, email us at membership@midlandparkac.org



CERT Seeks Volunteers!

Midland Park has a trained Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) to augment our first responders. CERT members can play an integral part by giving critical support in an emergency or disaster situation by searching for lost/missing children or adults, staffing the Emergency Operations Center (EOC), managing volunteers, and providing minor first aid. CERT members also assist with non-emergency projects and help improve the community, as in assisting with Community Day or the Memorial Day Parade.

If you join CERT, you will receive basic level training in the following areas:

- Disaster Preparedness
- Basic Fire Suppression
- Basic Medical Operations (triage, first aid)
- Basic Search and Rescue Techniques
- Disaster Psychology & Team Organization
- Homeland Security Information



Midland Park CERT is always on the lookout for new volunteers! Total training is usually about 20 hours, scheduled in 2-4-hour modules, over a period of weeks or months, in order to address the scheduling needs of team members. Training courses, student materials and equipment are provided free of charge. 

Leaf Collection Safety Tips

- Do not allow children to play in the leaves.
- Do not park on leaves.
- Keep vehicles off the street on days scheduled for leaf collection in your district.
- Leaves should be raked to the edge of the road, not into the lane of traffic, and kept at least 10 feet away from storm water catch basins as per state storm water regulations.
- Leaves at the curb must be either loose or in paper bags.
- Leaves and other vegetative matter may be brought to the Recycling Center.

Protect Our Drinking Water

Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides.

- Do a soil test to see if you need fertilizer and do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted or consider alternatives for pesticides.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow all instructions carefully.

Properly use and dispose of hazardous products.

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain.
- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.

Clean up after your pet.

- All pet owners and keepers are required by law to immediately and properly dispose of their pet's solid waste on any public or private property not owned by that person.
- Use newspaper, bags, or pooper-scoopers to pick up waste and dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.
- Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

Dispose of yard waste properly.

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains and follow yard waste collection rules.
- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.
- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.

Property Maintenance

The Property Maintenance Department is responsible for enforcing the laws regarding the safety, health and appearance of properties located within the Borough. The Property Maintenance Code is an essential part of maintaining the appearance and integrity of Midland Park. The Property Maintenance Official is responsible for conducting walk-around and on-demand Property Maintenance inspections of all Borough of Midland Park properties and enforce Codes to the benefit of resident health and safety.

The Property Maintenance officer handles matters concerning the external condition of all properties in the Borough and deals with everything from deteriorating buildings to unkempt yards. The objective of this office is to protect the health, safety, and the general welfare of the community. Any condition that is found to have a blighting effect on the neighborhood shall constitute cause for correction.

Property Maintenance issues include, but are not limited to:

- Impassable walkways
- Lack of maintenance, deteriorating structures
- Existence of hazards
- Suspected Infestations
- Overgrown lawns, bushes, and trees
- Obstructions of vision on public roadways
- Trash litter, garbage, and debris
- Invasive Plants, Bamboo
- Failure to clear snow from sidewalks and driveways
- Dead or Dying Trees and Bushes
- Unsanitary conditions
- Unsafe or damages sidewalks and driveways
- Abandoned Motor Vehicles & Trailers






