Museum Pass Policy

- Midland Park residents whose cards in are in good standing can borrow museum passes. (No fines over \$10 dollars). Passes go out for 3 days and can be requested once every 30 days by a cardholder.
- Passes are distributed on a first come, first served basis. No passes will be held over the phone. A patron must come into the library with a valid card.
- A \$50 dollar cash or check deposit is required for the pass. On return of the pass, the deposit will be refunded to the patron.
- Passes must be returned at the circulation desk NOT in the book drop. If a patron puts the pass in the book drop a \$10 fine will be put on their account.
- For each day late, a \$10 dollar fine will be put on the patron's account. If the pass is not returned the deposit will be kept and the patron will be billed the difference for the cost of the museum pass.

Intrepid

Each pass is for general admission and admits up to six (6) guests.

New York City's Intrepid Sea, Air & Space Museum Complex is an educational and cultural non-profit institution centered on the aircraft carrier Intrepid. The mission of the Museum is to promote the awareness and understanding of history, science and service through its collections, exhibitions and programming in order to honor our heroes, educate the public and inspire our youth.

Newark Museum

Each pass admits two (2) adults and all children under 18.

The Newark Museum, in Newark, Essex County, New Jersey, is the state's largest museum. It holds fine collections of American art, decorative arts, contemporary art, and arts of Asia, Africa, the Americas, and the ancient world. Its extensive collections of American art include works by Hiram Powers, Thomas Cole, John Singer Sargent, Albert Bierstadt, Frederick Church, Childe Hassam, Mary Cassatt, Edward Hopper, Georgia O'Keeffe, Joseph Stella, Tony Smith and Frank Stella.

Grounds For Sculpture

Each pass admits up to four (4) adults or children per visit.

Grounds For Sculpture is situated on the former New Jersey State Fairgrounds and includes three of its major historic buildings, restored for a variety of purposes. When you come to Grounds For Sculpture you can expect to find:

- A constantly evolving collection of superb contemporary outdoor sculptures
- 42 magnificently landscaped acres in which to stroll
- Rotating exhibitions in six indoor galleries

Storm King Art Center

A Library Pass (2 Membership cards) offers free admission to Storm King for two adults and up to 4 children under age 18, living at the same address.

Storm King Art Center is a 500-acre outdoor museum located in New York's Hudson Valley, where visitors experience large-scale sculpture and sitespecific commissions under open sky.

Montclair Art Museum

Each pass admits two (2) adults and all children under 18.

The Montclair Art Museum, a notable, community-based institution with an international reputation, boasts a renowned collection of American and Native American art that uniquely highlights art making in the United States over the last three hundred years. The collection includesmore than 12,000 objects: paintings, prints, original works on paper, photographs, and sculpture by American artists from the 18th century to the present, as well as traditional and contemporary Native American art and artifacts representing the cultural developments of peoples from all of the major American Indian regions. The Museum's education programs serve a wide public and bring artists, performers, and scholars to the Museum on a regular basis. MAM's Yard School of Art is the leading regional art school, offering a multitude of comprehensive courses for children, teens, adults, seniors, and professional artists.
