DISCUSSION ITEM:

1. 2022 Open Space Grant – Project Ideas

Borough Administrator/Clerk Martin stated that the Letter of Intent must be filed by April 8, 2022 for the 2022 Open Space Grant with the State. Some the ideas that have been suggested: improvements on the Borough sun dial (memory pavers), replace portions of the tennis courts' fencing, staging area by the Library, and a dog park by the Wortendyke Park far end.

Councilwoman DeLuca discussed the Woodside Avenue path. The Councilwoman suggested a paver walkway. Borough Administrator/Clerk Martin reported that there is no parking available for the public.

Council President Peet would like to see the Woodside Avenue property as a practice

soccer field. The Council President does not want to a have an unused property when there is such a demand for field usage. Ms. Martin will speak with Matthew Tauber regarding obtaining a water source and his input for the property. The 2019 Open Space Grant monies are partly being utilized for dog receptacle stations which will be erected by the Department of Public Works employees.
