Mayor Shortway called the Meeting to Order at 7:00 P.M.

DISCUSSION ITEM:

1. Ordinance #17-2022 Electric Vehicle Charging Stations (EVSE)

Borough Administrator/Clerk Wendy Martin stated there were minor changes made to the previously introduced and tabled Ordinance. **Mayor** and **Council** agreed to continue to reintroduction.

- 2. Ordinance #22-2022 Oversized Vehicles
 - Borough Administrator/Clerk Wendy Martin reported Ordinance #22-2022 is needed in order to prevent oversized vehicles being parked on properties in Midland Park. Borough Attorney Robert Regan stated this ordinance must go to the Planning Board for review. Ms. Martin has already planned to forward to Planning Board after Mayor and Council Meeting. - 3. Ordinance #23-2022 Traffic Chapter VII (Rubble Street & Witte Drive)
 Borough Administrator/Clerk Wendy Martin summarized Ordinance #23-2022. This
 Ordinance is to add no parking rules to particular/portions of Borough streets. Governing

Resolution #166-2022 Closed Session 10-13-2022

Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the federal government; Any matter the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy; Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of terms and conditions with employees or representatives of employees of the public body (Specify contract): Any matter involving the purpose, lease, or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of bank rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed; X Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public provided that their disclosure could impair such protection; Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law; Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer (If pending or anticipated litigation, the matter is: _____ contract negotiations the nature of the contract and in circumstances, if public disclosure of interested parties are the matter would have a potentially negative impact on the Borough's position in the litigation or negotiation, this information may be withheld until such time that the matter is concluded, or the circumstances no longer present a potential impact);

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employee's privacy rights under South Jersey Publishing, 124 N. J. 478, the employee(s) and nature of discussion is ______ Personnel and Mayor & Council By Laws

Any deliberation of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party as a result of an act of omission for which the responding party bears responsibility;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough Council hereby declares that its discussion of the aforementioned subject(s) may be made public at a time when the Borough Attorney advises the Borough Council that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the Borough, or any other entity, with respect to said discussion. That time is currently estimated as the time of said matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough Council, for the aforementioned reasons, hereby declares that the public is excluded from the portion of the meeting during which the above discussion shall take place, and hereby directs the Borough Clerk to take the appropriate action to effectuate the terms of this resolution.
