7:00 P.M. WORK SESSION MINUTES

On April 27, 2023 at 7:00 P.M., the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Midland Park conducted a meeting at Borough Hall located at 280 Godwin Avenue as previously advertised. Agenda items for the meeting were listed on the Borough website.

Mayor Shortway called the Meeting to Order at 7:04 P.M.

The Mayor read the Sunshine Law Statement: The meeting was held in accordance with the Sunshine Law, notice has been published according to law with a copy on file in the Borough Clerk's Office and a copy posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building.

Borough Administrator/Clerk Martin took a roll call of the public. Caleb Zuidema and Bruce Rosenberg were present.

DISCUSSION ITEM:

1. Boards, Committees, and Council - Agendas & Minutes Posted on Website

Borough Administrator/Clerk Wendy Martin requested that only the last three (3) years of Minutes be posted on the Borough's website for all committees, boards, and Mayor and Council meetings. The inception of Daniel's Law has created a voluminous amount of work for the Clerk's Office. Also, going forward, during the Public Comments if the Mayor and Council would ask for the speaker to state their name only, if they are residents in the Borough, and not their address. This will ensure compliance with Daniel's Law. The Governing Body agreed.

2. Offshore Wind Activity - Whale and Dolphin Deaths

Borough Administrator/Clerk Wendy Martin reported the Mayor received an email requesting support for a moratorium on all offshore wind activity. At this time, the Governing Body would table their support.

3. 90 Midland Avenue - Zuidema Property

Borough Attorney Robert Regan reported the **Governing Body** received a copy of the Planning Board's Resolution dated April 17, 2023 recommending the area of 90 Midland Avenue, identified as Block 45, Lot 9.01, as an "Area in Need of Redevelopment". Borough Administrator/Clerk Wendy Martin added that the application of the Department of Environmental Protection was also included in the meeting packets for reference. **Councilwoman Peet** would like to carry the discussion until more or all members of the Council are present. The **Governing Body** concurred.

ATTORNEY REGAN READ THE RESOLUTION

Resolution #082-2023 Closed Session 4-27-2023

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 allows for a Public Body to go into closed session during a Public Meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of Midland Park has deemed it necessary to go into closed session to discuss certain matters which are exempted from the Public; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Borough Council of Midland Park will go into closed session for the following reason (s) as outlined in N.J.S.A. 10:4-12:

Any matter which, by express provision of Federal Law, State Statute or Rule of Court shall rendered confidential or excluded from discussion in public (Provision relied upon):

Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the federal

government;
Any matter the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy;
Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are proposed for
inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of terms and conditions with
employees or representatives of employees of the public body (Specify contract):
Any matter involving the purpose, lease, or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting
of bank rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion
of such matters were disclosed;
X Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public provided that
their disclosure could impair such protection;
Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law;
Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is or may
become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality
is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer (If pending or anticipated
litigation, the matter is: contract negotiations the nature of the contract and interested party is in circumstances, if public disclosure of
contract and interested party is in circumstances, if public disclosure of
the matter would have a potentially negative impact on the Borough's position in the litigation or
negotiation, this information may be withheld until such time that the matter is concluded, or the
circumstances no longer present a potential impact);
X Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and
conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance, promotion or disciplining of any specific
prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the
public body, unless all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request
in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting (Subject to the balancing of the
public's interest and the employee's privacy rights under South Jersey Publishing, 124 N. J. 478, the
employee(s) and nature of discussion is Personnel
Any deliberation of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the
imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or
permit belonging to the responding party as a result of an act of omission for which the responding party
bears responsibility;
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough Council hereby declares that its discussion of the

aforementioned subject(s) may be made public at a time when the Borough Attorney advises the Borough

Council that the disclosure of the discussion will not detrimentally affect any right, interest or duty of the Borough, or any other entity, with respect to said discussion. That time is currently estimated as the time of said matter.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Borough Council, for the aforementioned reasons, hereby declares that the public is excluded from the portion of the meeting during which the above discussion shall take place, and hereby directs the Borough Clerk to take the appropriate action to effectuate the terms of this resolution.
