Administrator Seemon took a roll call of the public in attendance There were no members of the public on the line at this time.

LIAISON REPORTS:

Mayor Shortway

Mayor Shortway reported on June 9th, he and Administrator Seemon were on a call with the Governor's office regarding the coronavirus; on June 11, he and Administrator Seemon were on a call with the County Executive regarding what can and cannot be done with re-opening, noting the Administrator will give more details during his report.

Councilman Sansone Public Works/ Board of Education/ Chamber of Commerce Councilman Sansone reported progress for the Board of Education, the Chamber of Commerce and the Department of Public Works.

Councilwoman Peet Finance/Board of Health

Councilwoman Peet reported progress for Finance.

The **Councilwoman** reported the **Board of Health** has hired a new health officer who will be starting July 7th. She noted the number of COVID-19 cases in Midland Park was last updated on May 26th and remains at 90 with 4 demises.

Council President DeLuca Public Safety – Fire/Ambulance/ Personnel/Library

Council President DeLuca reported the **Ambulance Corps** held an outdoor meeting on June 1st: they answered 37 calls for May.

The **Council President** reported the **Fire Department** did not have a meeting but the report from the Chief stated they answered 17 calls for May, including a structure fire on Park Avenue. The Chief also noted the department will be going back to drills and normal operations while remaining cautious.

Council President DeLuca reported the **Library** Director will be attending a virtual meeting on June 12th with the Governor's office for plans on re-opening the library; she will have a more detailed report at the next Council meeting.

Councilman Kamp Recreation/Municipal Alliance/Ridgewood Water Due to Councilman Kamp's absence, a report was emailed to the Governing Body.

Councilman IannonePublic Safety – Police/ Information TechnologyDue to Councilman Iannone's absence, no report was given.

Councilman Kruis Planning Board/Building Dept/ Fire Prevention/OEM/Property Maintenance

Councilman Kruis reported the **Planning Board** will be meeting next week so he will have a report at the next Council meeting.

The **Councilman** reported progress for the **Building Department:** he will be meeting with the Construction Official sometime during the next week.

Councilman Kruis reported he met with the Official for the **Office of Emergency Management**, **Property Maintenance and Fire Prevention** several times and there is progress.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Borough Administrator Seemon reported he and **Mayor Shortway** were on a call with the County Executive today and several things were announced: Saturday, at 7A.M. all parks will be re-opened and picnicking will be allowed with the stipulation that no more than eight people gather together at a table; dog parks are still under discussion; more will be coming regarding ways small businesses are being helped and outdoor dining guidelines were discussed. The Borough is trying to do everything possible to operate under the Governor's orders correctly while still trying to help residents and businesses; the next phase of roadwork will be curbing for Aqueduct Avenue and West View Place and the contractor will be reaching out to the residents that will be affected; work at Borough Hall is being completed to ensure safe a re-opening; the staff is doing a phenomenal job, keeping things as normal as possible.

ORDINANCES ON FINAL:

1. ORDINANCE #08-20

"A CAPITAL ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL FUNDS TO THE RESERVE FUND, FOR MUNICIPAL VEHICLES IN THE BOROUGH OF MIDLAND PARK, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$15,000.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE FUTURE PURCHASE OF MUNICIPAL VEHICLES"

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Midland Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey as follows:

Section 1.

The acquisition of funding from the Capital Improvement Fund is hereby authorized for:

A. Midland Park Department of Public Works' Reserve for a new garbage truck, in the amount of \$15,000.00

Section 2. The sum of \$15,000.00 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of such acquisition and improvement authorized and described in Section 1 hereof. Said sum so appropriated shall be met from the Capital Improvement Fund of the Borough.

Section 3. Said improvements are lawful capital improvements of the Borough having a period of usefulness of at least five (5) years. Said improvements shall be made as a general improvement, and no part of the cost which has been nor shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 4. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this capital ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 5. This ordinance hereby incorporates the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect at the time and in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts or ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies. In addition, ordinance #07-20 be it and is hereby repealed in its entirety.

2. **ORDINANCE #09-20**

"AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 4 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF MIDLAND PARK ENTITLED, "GENERAL LICENSING"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Midland Park, in the County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1.

Chapter 4 of the Code of the Borough of Midland Park, General Licensing, §4-18, Outdoor Cafes In The Business Districts, Subsection 4-18.19, Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages Prohibited, be and is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 2.

Chapter 4 of the Code of the Borough of Midland Park, General Licensing, §4-18, Outdoor Cafes In The Business Districts, Subsection 4-18.20, Time Period for Outdoor Cafes, is hereby amended to read as follows:

§4-18.20. Time Periods for Outdoor Cafes.

Outdoor cafes shall be permitted to operate throughout the calendar year from January 1 to December 31. The license, when issued, shall be valid for the entirety of the calendar year which it was issued.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, sentence or any other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not effect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance but shall be confined in its effect to the section, sentence or other part of this Ordinance directly involved in the controversy which such judgment shall be rendered.

Section 4. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.

All ordinances or parts or ordinances which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

The change in the bid threshold allows municipalities with a Qualified Purchasing Agent to increase their bid threshold up to \$44,000; and WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-3a, permits an increase in the bid threshold if a Qualified Purchasing Agent is appointed as well as granted the authorization to negotiate and award such contracts below the bid threshold; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:34-5 et seq. establishes the criteria for qualifying as a Qualified Purchasing Agent; and

WHEREAS, Sean P. Canning of The Canning Group was appointed the Borough of Midland Park's Qualified Purchasing Agent by the adoption of Resolution #006-20 and possesses the qualifications and designation of Qualified Purchasing Agent as issued by the Director of Local Government Services in accordance with N.J.A.
