7:00 P.M. -Work Session Minutes

On July 8, 2021 at 7:00 p.m., the Mayor and Council of Midland Park conducted an in person meeting the location has changed to 280 Godwin Avenue, there was also an option for the public to access the meeting electronically by dialing this Toll-Free Dial in number  $\underline{1}$  866 899 4679 Access Code: 335-352-949

Agenda items for the meeting were listed on the Borough website. The foregoing electronic option was recommended due to the current situation involving the COVID-19 Virus and directives of State and County governments.

**Mayor Shortway** called the Meeting to Order at 7:00 P.M.

**The Mayor reads the Sunshine Law Statement:** This meeting is being held in accordance with the Sunshine Law, notice having been published according to law with a copy on file in the Borough Clerk's Office and a copy posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building.

Acting Borough Administrator/Clerk Martin took a roll call of the public

No members of the public were on the line or present in-person

#### **DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

1. Bond Counsel – Steve Rogut – spoke of the proposed Bond issuance, noting the amount would be \$3,809,000, part of which is comprised of the bond ordinance in 2020 in the amount of \$1,393,000 and the ordinance presented tonight in the amount of \$2,416,000. He explained that the maximum term of the bond is based on the average life of the assets being financed; because the majority of items being financed is equipment, the life is considered nine years. This is very good when presenting the bond to the market because the shorter term will pay a lower interest rate and the people buying the bonds want to know that the debt will be paid off quickly. He then presented two maturity schedules for paying it off: the first one results in level debt service, in which is the interest payment stays the same, \$465,022, with the tax impact on the average home assessed at \$397,000, to be about \$170

per year; the second schedule shows a scenario where the interest payments increase over time, which results in debt service starting at \$370,000 and steadily increasing to \$534,000 per year. He explained this scenario was done to try to line up the debt service with what was budgeted for capital this year and, for 2022, would be in line with what was budgeted to pay cash for capital items this year and increase by about \$20,000 each year. Mr. Rogut noted that, due to the low interest rates, using schedule #2 would only cost \$22,000 more than schedule #1. He explained more of the bond issue process and answered questions from the Council.

2. Observing 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of 9/11 – Councilwoman DeLuca reported there are people who have plans in the works but she is not sure what is involved. There was a discussion as to coordinating a community effort to include churches, schools, Scouts and other organizations that want to contribute. It was suggested that the Recreation Director reach out to the people who have started working on it and collaborate with them for setting up a commemorative program.
